# CANCELLATION OF EXTREME HEAT EMERGENCY WARNING

The State Emergency Service advises that the risk to your safety due to the recent very hot weather has decreased and the Extreme Heat Warning issued on Tuesday, 7 February, 2017 has been cancelled.

While temperatures have reduced, hot days may still be experienced. It may take you a few days to recover and you should continue to take care.

The following actions will help you to stay healthy:

- Continue to drink plenty of water
- Open doors and windows to cool your home
- Get plenty of rest, and
- Check on family, friends and neighbours to see if they need help.

You should also keep in mind that trees may still drop their branches without warning, especially if the weather is windy. Don't let children climb or play under them and avoid parking or camping under large branches.
