Emergency response



If you are deaf, hard of hearing or speech impaired, you can use the [National Relay Service](#) to make an emergency call to police, fire or ambulance:

> If you are a TTY user dial 106.

> Speak and Listen users dial
1800 555 727 then ask for Triple Zero (000).

> Internet Relay users visit the following link
www.iprelay.com.au/call/index.aspx and then type in Triple Zero (000).

Non-Emergency calls



If you are deaf, hard of hearing or speech impaired, you can use the [National Relay Service](#) to make non-emergency calls to emergency services information numbers:

> If you are a TTY user, dial:

1800 555 677 to call a 1800 number; OR
133 677 for all numbers apart from 1800 numbers,

then ask for the emergency services information number that you need.

> Speak and Listen users dial:

1800 555 727 to call a 1800 number; OR
1300 555 727 for all numbers apart from 1800 numbers,

then ask for the emergency services information number that you need.
