## FLOOD ADVICE MESSAGE REDUCED THREAT

The SES advises that the flood risk for the Bremer River, including Langhorne Creek, has reduced. River levels are reducing but remain higher than normal.

Although the threat to your safety has reduced, be aware that some risks are still present and you should take care in the area over the next few days.

Never allow children to play in or near floodwater. You should never walk, ride or drive through floodwater. Be aware that mud, tree branches and other debris may still be on roads or that the road surface and verges may have been damaged.

If your property has been flooded do not turn your electricity back on until it has been checked by a qualified electrician and be aware that, if you rely on rainwater or similar source, your household water supply may not be safe.
